

Annual Parish Meeting

All Parishioners are invited to attend the Annual Hartshorne Parish Meeting.

When: Tuesday 15th May 2012

Where: The Dethick Hall, Manchester Lane

Time: 7.30pm (Tea and biscuits available at 7.00pm)

The Annual Parish Meeting presents an opportunity for Hartshorne parishioners to hear about matters dealt with by the Parish Council during the last 12 months, the Council's finances, where the money goes to and comes from and future plans. Reports will also be received from clubs and organisations operating within the Parish. Parishioners may also bring to the meeting any local issues of general concern.

PARISH FINANCE

In January of each year the Parish Council prepares a budget for the next financial year beginning in April. A balanced budget is set with expenditure on parish amenities and administration being matched by income from South Derbyshire District Council and the parish precept (from parish council tax payers). The Parish Council has decided that the precept shall remain at £9600 for 2012/13. Once again this is one of the lowest precepts of all the parishes in South Derbyshire and means that the contribution paid by each band D property for the coming financial year will be £7.89. Other banded properties will contribute on a pro rata basis. Total annual turnover for the Parish is approximately £21000.

The Parish accounts will be presented at the annual Parish Meeting at the Dethick Hall on the 15th May.

THE VILLAGE IDIOTS

It is said that every village has one but it appears that Hartshorne is particularly well blessed! A group of locals, with precious little theatrical experience between them, got together to raise money for St. Giles Hospice by performing a comedy drama. The *'Village Idiots'* drama group was born.

The culmination of many hours of rehearsal, ground-breaking computerised effects and elaborate costume and set design was *The Blonde on the Bonnet* by Jennifer Curry. (Set in the 1960's George Gubbins buys a new car which comes complete with a blonde!)

The production played to sell-out audiences at the Dethick Hall over two nights in February and raised over £1300 for the hospice!! A fantastic achievement.

Over thirty people were involved in the production and special mention must be made of the director, Keith Weaver who, when asked about the next production, was heard to say, 'never again', hopefully public demand may change his mind.

Hartshorne CC is an ambitious club currently fielding junior and senior teams.
