

Parish Council NEWS

Annual Parish Meeting - Thursday 19th April 2018, Dethick Hall, 7.30pm

All Parishioners are invited to attend the Annual Hartshorne Parish Meeting on Thursday 19th April 2018 at the Dethick Hall, Manchester Lane (next to the Bull's Head) at 7.30pm (Tea and biscuits available at 7.00pm)

The Annual Parish Meeting presents an opportunity for Hartshorne parishioners to hear about activities within the Parish during the last 12 months. A report will be presented by the Parish Council Chairman to include the Council's finances. Reports will also be received from clubs and organisations operating within the Parish. Parishioners may bring to the meeting any local issues of general concern.

Hartshorne Parish Council, Chairman's Comments

During the course of the past year we have made representations to the District Council about local environmental issues, untidy sites and fly tipping, to the County Council about highway maintenance issues and traffic congestion. We have supported residents on planning issues such as the proposal for holiday cabins on Manchester Lane, and made representations to the District Council on other planning applications where we have thought that they would have an effect on the local community.

We continue to employ a lengths man to carry out litter picking duties on the pavements and recreation grounds and maintenance has been carried out on play equipment on the recreation grounds.



Funding was provided during the year to allow the presence of the District Sportsmobile on each of the three recreation grounds during the summer holidays. Financial support has also been given to the local cricket club.

I would like to thank Mr Corcoran who for many years has volunteered to maintain the Village Green at the junction of Repton Road and Brook Street. Mr Corcoran now wishes to retire from this activity. If anybody would like to take over this role could they please contact the Clerk at the address below.

One of our Parish Councillors representing the Lower Midway Ward has recently resigned from the Parish Council. Dog Fouling

For many years dog fouling has been a major problem throughout the Parish, including the Village, Goseley and Lower Midway. In an attempt to try and resolve this problem South Derbyshire D.C. have increased the fixed penalty notice from £75.00 up to £1000.00. This fine not only applies to pavements and footpaths but our recreation grounds.

In conjunction with the District Council the Parish Council is asking for your help, so if you see a dog owner failing to clean up after their dog can you contact South Derbyshire DC's Dog wardens with as much information as possible, i.e. Dog owners name, where offence took place and the time. It has worked with the Hartshorne Residents Association to expand the Community Speed Watch facilities and additional speed watch operatives have been trained and they will be active within the parish over the summer months of 2018.

The Lee Wood Valley Residents Association (LWVRA)

The Lee Wood Valley Residents Association (LWVRA) is a voluntary organisation that was initially set up to oppose a planning application for housing in the strip of woodland known as Lee Wood Valley. The association gave the local community a voice which resulted in the planning application being turned down. The property developer did not appeal and the temporary tree preservation order on the site has been made permanent. At present the area is not part of the Council's local plan part 2 for housing development.

The main aim of the LWVRA is to protect, promote and represent the majority view of the community. By working with and through the Parish, District and County councils as well as other local Resident Associations, such as the Hartshorne Village Residents Association, we can voice our needs, concerns and support in respect to services, roads, public transport, tree preservation and planning applications.

Although it's been a quiet time recently, mainly because everyone has been so busy, members are consulted and kept informed of relevant information and local matters either by the website, email or a hand delivered newsletter.

The next meeting will be the association's AGM on the 16th April in the Dethick Hall at 1930hrs and will be followed by a familiarisation session on using a defibrillator as we have had one installed on Leawood Road, courtesy of the Parish Council and Lisa and Lee Vale.

Anyone interested in volunteering to be part of this EMAS scheme, and making a difference in our community should contact Kim Coe on 07850 666125.


Defibrillator in the Parish

Three new Defibrillators have been installed at Goseley Community Centre, the Admiral Rodney and Leawood Road in Lower Midway. 15 residents attended a

training session in the use of the defibs, this was arranged by Councillor Kim Coe. If you are interested in being trained and there is sufficient interest an additional course can be arranged.

Hartshorne Charities (Registered Charity No. 236972)

The Parish is fortunate to have a Charity solely for the benefit of residents of Hartshorne. It dates back almost 400 years when the Rev. Dethick left property and money for the benefit of the poor. Over the years other like-minded residents have made donations and in the 1960's the individual sums of money left to the village were amalgamated by the Charity Commissioner to form Hartshorne Charities. The Trustees meet quarterly to consider requests for grants and many students who are living away from home and attending recognised university courses are helped by providing grants towards books and other items needed for their studies. Last year the Charity made awards to more than a dozen University Students and helped with the provision of school clothing. The Charity is self-financing and does not receive money from any outside body. Trustees can make grants for those in genuine need and who are resident in the Hartshorne ecclesiastical parish. 'The Dethick Hall' Your Local Village Hall

The Hall has had new electric heaters fitted that can be controlled by users so you can regulate the temperature to suit individual activities. New lightweight tables have been purchased that make it easier for people to handle. The heavier tables have been donated to the new cricket club pavilion. Cushions are now provided for the chairs.

Hire rates remain the same at £6.00/hour for non-commercial groups and £8.00/hour where fees are charged. For children's parties in the afternoon and evenings the rate is from £60.00.

The Hall has two table tennis tables and equipment for community use. Room hire charges only apply and the use of the tables is free. There is also a "short mat" bowling floor covering that can be made available for anyone wanting to set up a team.
