

Parish and District Elections

On Thursday the 5th of May 2011 elections will be held for Hartshorne Parish Council and South Derbyshire District Council. Just for good measure the government has decided to hold a referendum at the same time on changing the way MPs are elected, the choice being between an Alternative Vote system or the present first past the post system.

The Parish and District elections are of particular significance for Hartshorne as, due to a recent Boundary Commission review, the Parish has now been 'warded'. Lower Midway has been placed in the District's Midway Ward whilst Hartshorne Village, Woodville Road, Goseley Estate and Boundary have been placed in the Woodville Ward.

The Hartshorne and Ticknall ward is no more.

The Parish and the composition of the Parish Council however remains the same, i.e. 15 members. Because of the warding arrangement 6 members are to be elected in the Lower Midway ward and 9 from the Village/Goseley ward.

The District Council should have notified all electors of the new arrangements and indicated the polling stations

He had also been a District Councillor for the old Hartshorne ward and was keenly interested in the community he served. Having worked for the National Coal Board and Severn Trent Water plc he was also interested in local history in general and coal mining history in particular. He had compiled and published booklets on local industrial history. He was very knowledgeable on many topics and contributed greatly to the meetings and the work of the Parish Council.

Alan, together with local residents at Goseley, obtained funding which enabled the building of Goseley Community Centre and there can be no better lasting memorial to him

SCOUTS' PROGRESS (Report from Carole Johnson) 1st Hartshorne Scouts

The Scout Group has steadily grown since it was formed last year. The Cubs have risen to 27 and there are 18 Scouts. The Troop is as full as we can manage with our current leadership levels.

Since last April, we have had success in the District Sports when we won the Scout section trophy and, later in December, our Scouts were runners up in the District Scout Cooking Competition. They were also awarded the Chef's plate for best teamwork. Five Cubs were part a guard of honour at the appointment of new SDDC Chairman. We have camped quite frequently. The Scouts joined Newhall for a survival camp at Willesley in May as part of their survival badge and at the end of the month we took both Cubs and Scouts for a long weekend camp at Drum Hill enjoying a wide range of activities and entertainment at the County Spring Bank Activity Camp. The Cubs went off to Drum Hill again for the District Cub Camp in June and the Scouts had a very basic camp in Calke Park in August - chemical toilet and open fires. Another Scout camp at Willesley in October was more civilised - but open fires again. Our Cubs thoroughly enjoyed a sleepover and night time treasure hunt in the Repton HQ in December, which helped towards their navigator's badge. The Scouts did a one night chiller challenge camp in January - a challenge by the county for which they earned a special pennant. We happened to pick the best Saturday night in January, it was so mild that the Leaders were outside in their shirt sleeves quietening the kids at 2.00 a.m.

We have enjoyed activities other than camping. In December, the Scouts went in the district minibus to Beaumont Leys. They climbed on the 18.5 m wall and then went swimming in the wave pool. In February the Cubs walked on the annual District Night Hike which took them around Linton farmlands, in the dark! The weather was perfect. Later in the month the Cubs went to Swadlincote Fire Station for a fascinating visit. There was an excellent turn out at the Woodville remembrance parade service and we hope to be at Hartshorne Parish church next year.

The weekly Friday meetings have covered a range of programmes leading to challenge awards and interest badges and lots of fun. We have had visiting speakers, played lots of games, made things and learned many new skills. The Scouts have enjoyed navigation exercises, night walks and a visit to Buildings Farm Wood for orienteering. We tried a Beetle Drive to raise £50 to pay for an Aquabox as part of the global challenge.

In March the Cubs are off to Kibblestone, near Stone, for an activity day including crate stacking, rock climbing, potholing, archery etc. We are again taking Cubs and Scouts to the Spring Bank Camp and the Cubs are going to Carsington Reservoir to celebrate 95 years of Cubbing and later will be going to the District Cub Camp. There are two water activity weekends planned for the Scouts at Trent Lock and we intend to have some patrol camps and hill walking and we hope to be allowed to use Hartshorne School field for archery.

We are in the process of purchasing some camp cooking equipment, another lamp, camping tables and benches courtesy of a Molson Coors (UK) Community Award Scheme grant, which we were lucky enough to be awarded.

We are grateful for the use of the Community Centre and have been very generously supported financially by the Parish Council, Hartshorne Charities, Derbyshire County Council, Pat Murray, Molson Coors and Rotary Club.

Hartshorne C of E Primary School

The Primary School in the village is inspected by OFSTED and, as a Church of England school, by the Diocese of Derby. It is considered by both to be one of the best schools in the area. It obtained a very good OFSTED report in 2010 judging it to be a good school with outstanding features. The Anglican Inspection judged the school to be outstanding in all areas! Children say they enjoy coming to school and with the many facilities such as its own playing field, outdoor covered classroom and nature reserve there is plenty for them to do.
