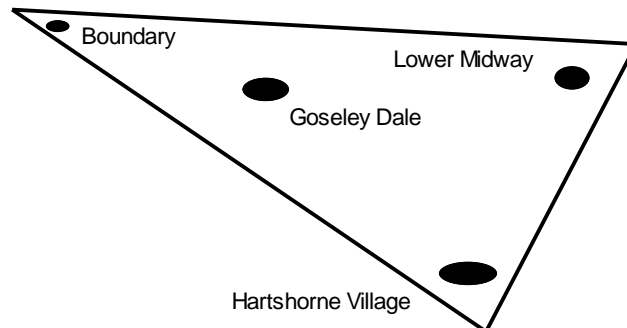

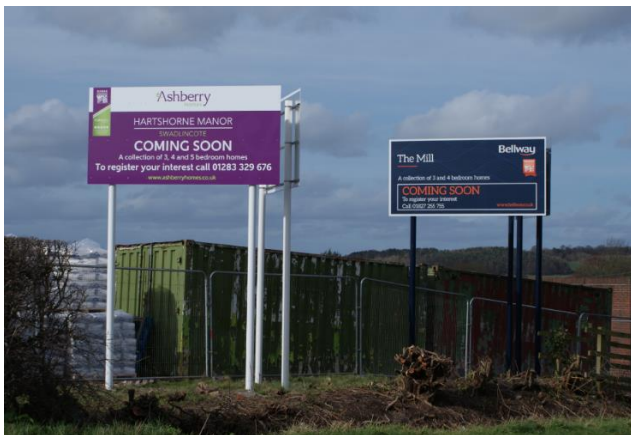
Annual Parish Meeting – Thursday 18th April 2019, Dethick Hall, 7.30pm

All Parishioners are invited to attend the Annual Hartshorne Parish Meeting on Thursday 18th April 2019 at the Dethick Hall, Manchester Lane (next to the Bull's Head) at 7.30pm (Tea and biscuits available at 7.00pm)

The Annual Parish Meeting presents an opportunity for Hartshorne parishioners to hear about activities within the Parish during the last 12 months. A report will be presented by the Parish Council Chairman to include the Council's finances. Reports will also be received from clubs and organisations operating within the Parish. Parishioners may bring to the meeting any local issues of general concern.

Hartshorne Parish Council, Chairman's Comments

During the past year your Parish Council has met monthly, except for during August. We have made representations to the District Council on local environmental issues, and on planning applications where we believed that they would have an effect on the local community. They County Council has been contacted on road maintenance and traffic issues, and to request the return of the vehicle activated speed sign on Sandcliffe Road.



We have maintained the three recreation grounds in the Parish and have arranged for the Summer Activities programme to return this year. The Salisbury Drive football pitch has been brought back into use, and we continue to look for a club to use the football pitch at the Goseley Recreation Ground. We provide the allotments on Tower Road and employ a lengthsman to carry out litter picking duties in the Parish. Financial support has been provided to Goseley Community Centre to provide replacement doors, and for maintenance of the church clock.

I would like to thank all those people who volunteer to improve the appearance of the Parish, and to run local community groups.

November saw the sad passing of our Vice-chairman, Douglas Jenkinson. Doug served on the Parish Council for many years, was a major presence in many Parish organisations, and will be greatly missed.

To be eligible to stand you must be -

UK or eligible Commonwealth Citizen or a citizen of any member of the European Union; at least 18 years old; and must be on the electoral register for the Parish, or have occupied land/other premises, mainly work within the Parish, or live within 3 miles of the Parish boundary, for the previous 12 months.

Dog Fouling

For many years dog fouling has been a major problem throughout the Parish, including the Village, Goseley and Lower Midway. In an attempt to try and resolve this problem South Derbyshire D.C. have increased the fixed penalty notice from £75.00 up to £1000.00. This fine not only applies to pavements and footpaths but our recreation grounds. In conjunction with the District Council the Parish Council is asking for your help, so if you see a dog owner failing to clean up after their dog can you contact South Derbyshire DC' s Dog wardens with as much information as possible, i.e. Dog owners name, where offence took place and the time. Hartshorne Village Website

The main aim of the LWVRA is to protect, promote and represent the majority view of the community. By working with and through the Parish, District and County councils as well as other local Resident Associations, such as the Hartshorne Village Residents Association, we can voice our needs, concerns and support in respect to services, roads, public transport, tree preservation and planning applications. Defibrillators in the Parish

Hartshorne Charities (Registered Charity No. 236972)

In 1626 the Rev. William Dethick left money to aid the poor of Hartshorne. Over the years eight other Parishioners bequeathed sums to the poor. In 1963 the Charity Commissioners combined all these individual charitable trusts and formed Hartshorne Charities. The Commissioners Deed states that the Trustees can only make grants to those who reside in the Parish of St. Peter Hartshorne. The Trustees, all local people, consider a variety of requests for assistance including books for university students, school clothing, help with travel expenses for regular hospital visits etc.

Applications for a grant should be made in writing to the Secretary, Mrs. S Shakespeare at 18 Main Street, Hartshorne, DE11 7ES, explaining why a grant is required. Applications will be considered by the Trustees at their quarterly meetings, usually held in February, May, August and November. Remember grants can only be made to those living in the Hartshorne Parochial District. Full details of the Charity can be found on the Charity Commissioners web site, under the Charity's Registered Number 236972. The next meeting of the Trustees of Hartshorne Charities when grant applications will be considered is the 10th April 2019.

'The Dethick Hall' Your Local Village Hall

Hire rates remain the same at £6.00/hour for non-commercial groups and £8.00/hour where fees are charged. For children's parties in the afternoon and evenings the rate is from £60.00.

The Hall has two table tennis tables and equipment for community use. Room hire charges only apply and the use of the tables is free. There is also a "short mat" bowling floor covering that can be made available for anyone wanting to set up a team.
