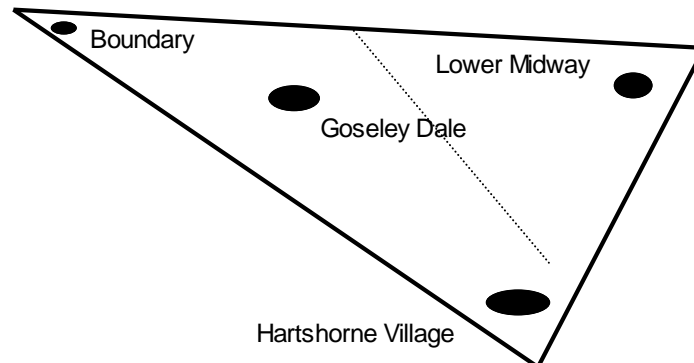

Parish Council NEWS

Annual Parish Meeting – Thursday 12th May 2022, Dethick Hall, 7.30pm

After an absence of two years, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we are pleased to invite all parishioners to attend the Annual Hartshorne Parish Meeting on **Thursday 12th May 2022 at the Dethick Hall**, Manchester Lane (next to the Bull's Head) at 7.30pm (Tea and biscuits available at 7.00pm)

The Annual Parish Meeting presents an opportunity for Hartshorne parishioners to hear about activities within the parish during the last 12 months. A report will be presented by the Parish Council Chairman to include the Council's finances. Reports will also be received from clubs and organisations operating within the Parish. Parishioners may bring to the meeting any local issues of general concern.

Parish Council, Chairman's Comments

In the past two years your Parish Council has continued to meet monthly, except during August, including a period where we were legally allowed to meet on-line. We are now meeting again in person on the second Monday of the month, and residents are invited to attend meetings and raise any issue of concern within the parish at the beginning of each meeting. Issues of concern have been raised with both County and District Council representatives, and we have made representations on planning applications when we believed that they would affect the local community.

We have maintained the three recreation grounds within the Parish and have arranged for the Summer Activities Scheme to return this year. Last year saw the retirements of both our long serving Lengthsman, Gordon Watts, and Parish Clerk, Richard Smith, and thank them for the work that they have done for the Parish over the years. We have appointed Bob Watts and Alison Barnes respectively to fill these roles.

Hartshorne Charities (Registered Charity No. 236972)

The Parish is fortunate to have a Charity solely for the benefit of residents of Hartshorne Parish. It dates to 1626 when the Rev. Dethick left property and money for the benefit of the poor. Over the years other likeminded residents have made donations and in the 1960's the individual sums of money were amalgamated by the Charity Commissioner to form Hartshorne Charities.

The Trustees meet quarterly to consider requests for grants, students who are studying a level 4 course, and attending a recognised university can apply for a grant towards books and equipment needed for their studies, as can people taking a recognised apprenticeship. The Trustees can make grants for those in genuine need and are residents of the Hartshorne Ecclesiastical Parish. Authentic 'Yoga' - the union of the mind and body:

Many people have the perception that to practice yoga you need to be flexible, stick thin and able to tie yourself in knots. Let's stop that idea right there if you can breathe you can do yoga! Yoga practice teaches us how to be still and how to still the mind.

Everyone can benefit from Yoga. My approach is one of authenticity, meaning that practicing yoga should be about working in an intelligent way to learn what is right for your body. Yoga is much more than making shapes with the body, it's a continual process of working with your mind and body to bring about positive improvement to health and wellbeing.

A general Yoga class is 90 minutes long and includes an introduction, a physical practice ending with relaxation or meditation, to bring about positive improvements to our physical and mental wellbeing, through movement, breathwork, relaxation and meditation techniques.

My approach to teaching yoga is to make the sessions interesting, enjoyable and fun. Feedback from my sessions is very positive. I am currently running a Monday Evening class at 6:45pm at the Dethick Hall and two new classes on a Wednesday morning at Hartshorne Cricket Pavilion. The first class 9:15am Yoga for Beginners and the second class 11:00am Chair Yoga, a more accessible version to benefit people who have less mobility, which can increase confidence and mobility, along with improving physical and mental wellbeing.
