

Dethick Hall

The Annual Parish Meeting presents an opportunity for Hartshorne parishioners to hear about activities within the parish during the last 12 months. A report will be presented by the Parish Council Chairman to include the Council's finances. Reports will also be received from clubs and organisations operating within the Parish. Parishioners may bring to the meeting any local issues of general concern.

Parish Council, Chairman's Comments

During the last year the Parish Council has installed fitness equipment for adults at the Main Street recreation ground, and is currently in the process of making improvements to the children's play equipment at Goseley recreation ground. We have again arranged for the District Council's Summer Play Scheme programme to make two visits to each of the three recreation grounds in the Parish (Salisbury Drive, Goseley and Main Street) during the school summer holidays. Grants have also been made to support the new pavilion at Hartshorne Cricket Club and a proposed extension at Goseley Community Centre. Recently the Parish Council has purchased, for a £1, the Telephone Box outside the Admiral Rodney from BT. Please let the Parish Clerk know if you have any suggestions as to what it could be used for.

Planning Matters

Rodney Meadow

The planning application submitted to South Derbyshire District Council houses on the field opposite the Admiral Rodney went to appeal in April 2016, where the case for both sides was heard by an independent

inspector. The decision of the inspector was to reject the appeal in support of SDDC's rejection the planning application.

Broomy Farm Development

The Broomy Farm development has been approved but some concerns particularly about access to the development from Woodville Road have been raised, the options for this road junction are still being considered.

Conservation and Area of Special Local Character

SDDC have consulted the Parish on two areas of Hartshorne Village; the Screw Mill Area around the Mill Wheel Public House as a conservation area and the area around St Peter's Church as an Area of Special Local Charater. The proposals have been put forward by the Hartshorne Residents Assosciation in an attempt to preserve the character of these two areas for future generations.

Speeding Campaigns

The Parish Council continues to monitor and respond to residents concerns over speeding vehicles on the roads within the parish. It is intending, with assistance from the Hartshorne Residents Association to utilise the **Community Speed Watch** facilities over the summer months.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling within the Parish is one of the most common complaints received by the Parish Council. The Parish Council would liketo remind all dog owners of their responsibility to bag up all their dog mess and deposit it in their black bin or one of the public bins located a varoius locations around the Parish. Hartshorne School children

have recently produced some posters to remind dog owners of their responsibilites.

Main St Recreation Ground

The Parish Council has installed two pieces of adult trim trail equipment at the Main Street recreation ground. The Council plans to add to the range of trim trail equipment in the future.

As well as running two senior teams in the Derbyshire County League, the support provided has enabled the club to develop one on the largest youth divisions in the county . This year Hartshorne will be running 4 junior teams from under 9 to under 15 and will also be hosting the ladies district team. Club members are working hard on the final touches to the community pavilion which will form a platform to host a series of community events including a

Picnic and Party on May 29th and an under 9s tournament on May 20th. A programme of other events, including our annual fireworks night, is being planned and the club are looking to link up with other groups to ensure the local community gets the most out of the new facility.

First Responders

Swadlincote Villagers Community First Responders (CFRs) play a vital role in saving lives; they attend life-threatening 999 calls in their local area and, by being so close, are able to arrive within minutes of the call for help being made. This means patients can be treated in those vital minutes whilst frontline paramedics travel to the scene. CFRs are trained in defibrillation and helping patients who are suffering strokes, breathing problems, chest pains, epileptic fits and diabetic problems. CFR schemes are self-funded and run by volunteers who rely on the generosity of local businesses and the public. Our CFR scheme is centred in Hartshorne Village and responds to emergency calls within a 6 mile radius. Hartshorne Charities (Registered Charity No. 236972)

The Parish is fortunate to have a Charity solely for the benefit of residents of Hartshorne Parish. It dates back to 1626 when the Rev. Dethick left property and money for the benefit of the poor. Over the years other like minded residents have made donations and in the 1960's the individual sums of money were amalgamated by the Charity Commissioner to form Hartshorne Charities. The Trustees meet quarterly to consider requests for grants and many students who are living away from home and attending a recognised university courses are helped by grants towards books and equipment needed for their studies. The Trustees are able to make grants for those in genuine need and are residents of the Hartshorne Ecclesiastical Parish. Should you require assistance please submit your request in writing to Cllr.
